

161 LAVENDER STREET

Located in the Jalan Besar Secondary Settlement where a 4-storey rear extension is allowed, the development retains the main buildings of the 11 units of shophouses and integrates a new 4-storey extension at the rear. This ensures the retention of the shophouse streetscape whilst maximising the development potential of the site through the creation of new and additional floor space at the rear. The owner has also taken the initiative to conserve part of the two corner units of shophouses to provide facade continuity at the streetscape.
