

The Black & White Bungalow

The Black & White Bungalow is characterised by a broad, simple, overhanging hipped roof and the sharp definition of openings in the plain white walls. The main features are as follows:

- (a) Use of half timber construction with timber structural members, all expressed internally in either cross-braced, horizontal or vertical manner. Within the timber structure are the infill plaster panels.
- (b) Roof materials of either overlapping V-profile of flat clay tiles.
- (c) In plan, the houses were built in a symmetrical layout with three bays across the front.
- (d) Open ground floor, except for the stair-hall and the garage.
- (e) Long and narrow main portion of the house of one room depth with continuous verandah along the front and sides.
- (f) Projecting verandahs at the second storey providing a carriage porch below.
- (g) Timber structural members and frames of doors and windows painted black with the infill plaster panels painted white.
- (h) Omission of ornamentation.
