This 19th century bungalow originally named Draycot was accorded conservation status in 2003. Once the residence of James Robertson, general manager and director of Guthrie & Company, it later housed the General Officer Commanding, Singapore Base District after World War II. From 1978 to 1995, it was the premises of the Alliance française.

The bungalow has since been restored to its former glory and adapted for use as a clubhouse. It retains most of its original architectural features such as the colonnaded verandas and cast iron grillwork over the windows and doors and of the balustrades.
